"Tell the AF Story," Says AFA Executive Vice Director

Lt Gen (Ret) Richard "Dick" Newton III told attendees at the 27 Jul 2013 Alabama State AFA Conference that the basic tenant of the Air Force will endure forever and that Americans need to understand the Air Force story and what we do...what we bring to the fight. General Newton, now serving as the AFA Executive Vice Director at the Headquarters, went on to remind us how from July to December of 1943 during WW II, we were losing 50% of our bombers. Leaders were faced with the choice of whether to continue to take the bombers to the enemy or pull back. The risk, of course, was losing them all. But if they backed off, the tenant of airpower would become an afterthought. So they pursued long-range bombers. And the question for today is, "Are we going to be aerospace nation or not?"

According to General Newton, we all need to tell our story and let America know that we do need the aerospace mission. We needed it in 1947, through the Cold War and now post 9-11. We need to maintain our edge to defeat future threats. We also must continue to grow the AFA membership base across the country, focus on the field, and never let America forget that we need to continue to be an aerospace nation.

Chapter 335 Looking for CP VI Teams

As most of you will recall, five years ago the Air Force Association decided to do something about the STEM education problem in our schools. They decided that a high school cyber defense competition was the best way to attract high school students to STEM. CyberPatriot uses the intrigue of cyber and the excitement of a competition as the best way to attract teenagers. The first year, the proof of concept competition, involved just eight teams, all from Florida. The competition has grown phenomenally to over 1,200 teams in all 50 states, DoD Dependent Schools in Europe and the Pacific, and in Canada. This year, the goal is to enroll 3,000 teams.

For the past couple of years, the Tennessee Valley Chapter, led by Rob Kuehn, has been assisting coaches and mentors in the northern Alabama area to enter, prepare and compete in this annual competition. Each year, more teams from our area have entered the competition. In the 2012-2013 competition (CyberPatriot V), several of the teams in our area placed in the top ranking in Alabama and the US Naval Sea Cadet Corps from Gardendale, Alabama, received the Best in Service Award.

This year, we need help identifying prospective CAP units, USNSCC units, JROTC units, and schools that have not yet become involved in CyberPatriot. The Chapter will then provide them information about the program and how they can get teams involved. The competition is divided into two divisions: a Service division and an Open division. AFA Announces Middle School

Cyber Program

The Air Force Association announced in April the expansion of its highly successful National High School Cyber Defense Competition, CyberPatriot, to middle schools beginning in the summer of 2013.

The CyberPatriot Middle School Program, developed in cooperation with the Center for Infrastructure Assurance and Security at the University of Texas at San Antonio, will allow middle school students to benefit from cyber security training similar to that which high school students have been experiencing since 2009.

"As a high school program, CyberPatriot has drawn enormous attention at the national level since its inception," CyberPatriot Commissioner Bernie Skoch said. "But a message we have received frequently is 'Now please do something to excite our middle school students about cyber security!' On behalf of the Air Force Association, I can only say 'Message received!"

The CyberPatriot Middle School program will begin with a lead pilot program in the Los Angeles Unified School District in late summer. The program will be expanded to more pilot areas in October 2013, centering on CyberPatriot's growing network of Centers of Excellence. 
